Legible copy of EACH horse's AMHA registration papers, FRONT & BACK. 2. Copy of Stallion Inspection Certificate on Senior Stallions. 3. Copy of lease (with AMHA stamp), if you are showing a leased horse. 4. Copy of current (2025) AMHA Youth/Amateur card. (These may be applied for through AMHA or at the horse show office). 5. A check for all fees payable to: OMHCI. All horses are required to have a negative coggins within 12 months and a health certificate within 30 days. DO NOT send these in with your paperwork, but bring them to the show; as you will NOT be able to show without them.

PLEASE NOTE: ALL entries can be EMAILED OR MAILED in and accompanied with the proper legible paperwork and required payment or an open check must be left on file in the show office. Entries must be emailed or mailed in by the pre-entry or they will be subject to late fees.

This miniature horse show is approved by and conducted under the rules of the American Miniature Horse Association (AMHA), Alvarado, TX. All horses MUST be registered with AMHA. A legible copy of both sides of the Certificate of Registration of each horse entered must be submitted to the Show Manager with each horse entry. Entries that are received without a copy of both sides of the registration papers will be held pending until such papers are submitted. A copy of lease (with AMHA stamp) for horses showing that are being leased. For geldings, gelding status must be reflected on the Certificate of Registration in order to show in any AMHA class. Along with your registration papers, please send a copy of your Stallion Testicular Report for any senior stallion entered. No youth under 12 years of age may show stallions, except weanling or yearling colts. No cross entry is allowed between single pleasure, country pleasure or classic pleasure driving - this includes open, amateur, and youth. AOTE & YOTE horses must be registered to the exhibitor on January 1 of the year being shown, to be eligible to show in the perspective AOTE & YOTE classes. Also necessary are current Youth and Amateur AMHA cards, (and provide numbers on the entry form) and a CURRENT NEGATIVE COGGINS; also a current health certificate within 30 days of the show. Youth and Amateur cards may be applied for through AMHA or at the horse show office. The Show Manager reserves the right to settle and determine all questions, differences and disputes arising out of or connected with or incident to this show; and to cancel or combine classes of this Show within the boundaries of AMHA's current show rules. Cruelty, abuse or inhumane treatment of any horse in the show ring, barn, stalls or on the grounds is strictly prohibited. The use of stimulants or depressants or any drug affecting the showing of a horse is forbidden.

NO LOGO'S, NAMES OR OTHER IDENTIFICATION OF PERSON OR FARM WILL BE ALLOWED ON ANY EXHIBITOR, HORSE OR VEHICLE IN THE SHOW ARENA. WARNING: Under Oklahoma Law, an equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities. RETURNED CHECK FEE OMHCI will charge a \$45.00 return check fee on all checks returned.

REFUND POLICY A full refund will be given if entries are cancelled in writing to the show manager before the closing date of the pre-entries. If entries are cancelled in writing accompanied by a veterinarian's or a doctor's certificate of inability to show. After the closing date of pre-entries, but before the official start of the show, all fees other than the stall, shavings and office fees will be refunded. After the official start of the show, there will be no refunds. The substitution of a horse will be accepted with no late fee .

LIBERTY TAPES & CD's - Management is NOT responsible for any loss or damage to Liberty music. It is PREFERRED for there to be one CD or tape PER ENTRY. If there is any question as to if your CD will work on the show equipment, please have it checked with show management before turning it in for the Liberty class.

SHOW & CLASS SPONSORS –

The cost of sponsoring a regular class is \$10 per class.

Grand & Reserves, Supreme and Amateur & Youth High Points sponsorship is \$30 per division.

Sponsors will be acknowledged during the show and are welcome to present awards for their classes. Sponsorships may be paid on the entry form; or on the class sponsorship form in the show office. Show sponsor levels are Platinum \$1K+, Gold \$500+, Silver \$100+ and Bronze \$50+ to be advertised at the show and on the website. JUDGE'S EVALUATION FORMS - are no longer mandatory, but they may be filled out on a voluntary basis. Forms are available in the Show Office

Directions to the Expo Center: The Expo Center is located 4 miles Southeast of I-40 (Exit 181) and Hwy. 177, then turn East at the stop light on Leo St. The exact address is Heart Of Oklahoma Expo Center, 17 West Independence Street, Shawnee, Ok 77804; (405)-275-7020. There is a downloadable map on the Expo Center website - ShawneeExpo.com. Wi-Fi is available at the Expo Center. The arena is indoors but not climate controlled. IMPORTANT - Absolutely NOTHING may be TAPED, STAPLED, or NAILED onto ANY surface, including stalls, on the grounds except on the designated bulletin boards. Otherwise fines will be imposed. Please help keep the facility clean. Please place trash and manure in the dumpsters outside. NO GLASS CONTAINERS and alcohol is not permitted. Thanks! Stall Assignments - stalls will be available by 12:00 p.m. on Friday, April 25, and must be vacated by 10:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 27. These are 10' x 10' stalls, and all have concrete floors. No more than two horses will be allowed in a stall. Stallions 2 years and older MUST be stalled separately. If you wish to stay over prior arrangements must be made in advance and additional fees may apply. The horse show office, arena, restrooms and concession are all located in the same building; there are three large warm-up areas between the arena and the stall barn.

There are multiple indoor wash racks. Savings may be purchased at the Show Office or pre-purchased on the entry form. No outside bedding may be brought onto the show grounds. Lunch break - will be announced at a time determined by the Show Manager. Concession - will be available on Sat & Sun. Pizza will be available without cost to the exhibitors and show staff on Friday evening near the Show Office. Dogs - MUST be kept on a leash or penned at all times; and animals are NOT allowed in the show office and concession area. Smoking - is NOT permitted inside the office, barns or arena areas.

RV Hookups: There are 30 and 50 AMP RV Hookups available on the grounds. There is also water available and a dump station on site, and numerous comfort stations with showers.

Trailer Parking: Please park your trailers to the north, west or south of the stall/arena barns; vehicles ONLY in the east lot.

The Heart Of Oklahoma Expo Center is located 4 miles South off of I-40 (Exit 181) & Hwy. 177; the turn East at the stop light on Leo Street. The exact address is 1700 West Independence Street,

Shawnee, OK. There is a downloadable map on the Expo Center website - www.ShawneeExpo.com. The map to the right is a view of the Expo Center, showing the location of the barns and RV parking. The RV spots to the West of the Expo are 30 amp only, they have water but no dump stations. All of the other spots are 30 & 50 amp, with water and dump facilities. There are also several comfort stations with showers in the RV areas. The Hampton Inn Shawnee - is our host hotel. It is located at 4851 North Kickapoo St. (Exit 185), off of I-40. It is on the south side of I-40, approximately 4 miles from the Expo Center. There is a free hot breakfast buffet, and free Wi-Fi. They do allow service pets for an extra charge. All rooms have a coffee maker, an iron/ironing board, hair dryer, microwave and refrigerator. The hotel has an indoor pool and fitness center, business center, laundry services. Near the hotel there is a Wal-Mart Super Center along with various other types of stores for your shopping needs or pleasure. There are also other grocery and convenience stores nearby. As for dining, there are several restaurants - Cracker Barrel, IHOP and McDonalds are near the hotel and near the Expo Center there is Bandana Red's Steakhouse and Abuelita Rosa's Mexican Restaurant. Throughout the town there are Steakhouses, Italian, Mexican, BBQ, Asian, Seafood as well as home style American cooking and other local fares for you to choose from; and many choices of fast food restaurants. For specialized shopping there is Shawnee Mill & Feed Center, Tractor Supply, S&S Farm Center, Atwood's, PetSmart, Lowes and Tener's Western Outfitters nearby. There are also a lot of thrift shops, antique shops, and local shopping malls. The first buildings on the town site were built in 1881, with a Quaker Mission being built in 1885. The town itself was founded in 1893. The railroad arrived in 1895 and the city prospered with the oil boom of the 1920's. The area surrounding Shawnee was settled after the Civil War by a number of tribes that the federal government had removed to Indian Territory. The Sac & Fox were originally deeded the land in the immediate area but were soon followed by the Kickapoo, Shawnee and Pottawatomie Indians. Shawnee is the county seat and also the home Oklahoma Baptist University (1910) and St. Gregory's University (1875). Located in the heart of cotton, potato and peach country, Shawnee quickly became an agricultural center. Famous people from Shawnee include Brad Pitt, Astronaut Gordon Cooper, Dr. Brewster Higley, VI - author of "Home On The Range" and athletes Jim Thorpe, Creed Humphrey and Carl Hubbell (Hubbell telescope). For other entertainment, there is the Santa Fe Depot/Pottawatomie Co. Museum, The Citizen Pottawatomie Nation Cultural Heritage Center, the Mabee-Gerrer Museum of Art, the Shawnee Little Theatre and the Cinema 8 Movie Theater. There are 2 bowling alleys and golf and there are 5 casinos in Shawnee: Black Hawk, Fire Lake, The Grand, Kickapoo and the Thunderbird. We hope you will enjoy your time in Shawnee!
